He details how its shoot was engulfed in acrimony and strife, including a spiraling budget, the leading lady breaking her arm, and intimidation from loitering real-life gang members. He explains how the controversy surrounding the movie caused Paramount Pictures to take the devastating decision to pull it from theaters.
