As in the plays of the Russian master, the characters talk a lot, but they rarely listen, still less understand, so they are often at cross-purposes. And like *The Seagull*, the long time scheme in *Quartermaine's Terms* - it spans several years - creates a poignant sense of transience and mortality.'
